Who can apply?	Undergraduate students majoring in biology, chemistry, physics, earth sciences, computer science, and engineering
What can be funded?	Research internship at universities and top research institutions
Duration of the funding	10 weeks to 3 months (90 days) during the summer

# **EMGIP - Bundestag Internship**

Who can apply?	Advanced undergraduate (junior and senior in US/third- or fourth-year in Canada) or Master's students in fields such as political science, international relations, law, history, economics, or German
What can be funded?	Internship in the Bundestag (the Ger- man parliament)
Duration of the funding	Two months

What can be funded?	A Master's degree course/postgradua- te degree course leading to a final qua- lification or A complementary course without degree
Duration of the funding	Between 10 and 24 months depending on the length of the chosen study program

# **University Summer Course Grant**

Applications are open to students in Bachelor's, Master's and PhD degree programs in any subject area; Bache- lor's students must have completed at least two academic years at the start of the scholarship period
Attendance of language and area stu- dies courses as well as special language / terminology courses that are offered by German universities and affiliated language schools
At least 18 teaching days in the period from June to December

What can be funded?	A research project or course of con- tinuing education at a university or a research institute in Germany, in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 to 6 months

#### **RISE Professional**

Who can apply?	Full-time Master's or PhD students, undergraduates who are RISE Germany alumni or recent graduates
What can be funded?	Research internships at companies and non-university research institutions with strong relations to industry
Duration of the funding	Up to 3 months (90 days) (between mid-May and end of December)
Value	<ul> <li>DAAD monthly stipend (varies based on academic level)</li> <li>An additional stipend of at least €500 net per month provided by a host company</li> <li>Travel allowance</li> <li>Health, accident and personal/private liability insurance</li> <li>€160 for travel to the three-day RISE Germany meeting in Heidelberg</li> <li>For there who plan to attend a language</li> </ul>

• For those who plan to attend a language course in Germany, DAAD covers 70 % of course-fees (max. €250)

# **Re-Invitation Grant**

Who can apply?	Former holders of DAAD research grants or study scholarships who were funded for a period of over six months
What can be funded?	Research at universities, libraries, archives, institutes, or laboratories in Germany.
Duration of the funding	1 to 3 months
Value	<ul> <li>Monthly payments dependent on academic level</li> </ul>

# **German Studies Research Grant**

Who can apply?	Undergraduate and graduate students who are nominated by their depart- ment/program chairs
What can be funded?	Short-term research in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months
Value	• US\$2,000 to US\$3,000

# Leo Baeck Institute – DAAD Fellowship

Who can apply?	PhD candidates or recent PhDs (degree awarded within the last two years)
What can be funded?	Research project in New York or Ger- many on the social, communal, and intellectual history of German-spea- king Jewry
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months
Value	<ul> <li>The New York fellowship consists of a lump-sum award</li> <li>The fellowship for Germany follows the terms of award for the DAAD German Studies Research Grant</li> </ul>

#### **Conference Funding in German Studies**

Who can apply?	Faculty members and advanced students in the humanities, social sciences, and related fields
What can be funded?	Co-funded workshops, seminars, and conferences that embrace the interdis- ciplinary and/or comparative study of the history, politics, economics, law, so- ciety, culture, and the arts of Germany
Value	<ul> <li>A minimum of 50% of project costs have to be contributed from other sources, including the university hos- ting the event</li> </ul>





Who can apply?	Postdocs working in the field of contemporary German literature are invited to apply	
What can be funded?	Summer research grant on contempo- rary German literature	
Duration of the funding	1 to 2 months	
Value	• Up to US\$3000	

#### **DAAD Faculty Summer Seminar in German Studies**

Who can apply?	Faculty members and recent PhDs in germane social science and cultural studies fields
What can be funded?	Participation in the seminar
Duration of the funding	4 to 6 weeks
Value	• Up to US\$3,200

#### **RISE Worldwide**

Who can apply?	Faculty, postdocs, PhD candidates, or researchers employed by or affiliated with an accredited academic instituti- on or a non-profit research institution, working in the field of natural sciences, earth sciences, Engineering, medicine, mathematics, or computer science	
What can be funded?	Host a German undergraduate rese- arch intern	
Duration of the funding	Six weeks to three months between June and October in the US. Interns- hips in Canada are between 10 weeks and 3 months	
Value	<ul> <li>German students are awarded a DAAD scholarship which includes:</li> <li>Monthly allowance (depending on target country)</li> <li>Travel subsidy (depending on target country)</li> <li>Health, accident and personal liability insurance</li> <li>Participation in a RISE Worldwide alumni meeting in Germany</li> </ul>	

# Postdoctoral Researchers International Mobility Experience (P.R.I.M.E.)

Who can apply?	Postdocs	
What can be funded?	Temporary positions at German universi- ties in place of conventional scholarships	
Duration of the funding	Funding is provided for 18 months, in which 12 months have to be spent abroad and 6 months (re-integration phase) at a German university	
Value	<ul> <li>Salary range of € 4,000 - € 5,000 per month pre-tax</li> <li>Plus approximately € 1,000 - € 2,000 per month expatriate allowance during the 12 months of your research stay abroad</li> </ul>	

# Leibniz - DAAD Fellowship Program

Who can apply?	Postdocs	
What can be funded?	Research at one Leibniz institute of their choice in Germany	
Duration of the funding	12 months	
Value	<ul> <li>Monthly installment of €2,000,</li> <li>Health, accident, and personal liability insurance as well as long-term care insurance in Germany</li> <li>Research allowance of €460 per annum</li> </ul>	

• Two-months German language course in Germany (if desired)

#### **DLR-DAAD Research Fellowship Program**

Who can apply?	Doctoral and postdoctoral students as well as senior scientists	
What can be funded?	Research in the fields of space, ae- ronautics, energy and transportation	
Duration of the funding	varies based on academic level	
Value	<ul> <li>Monthly stipend (varies based on academic level)</li> </ul>	

- Flat-rate travel allowance
- Health insurance
- Family allowances



# **Research Stays for University Academics and Scientists**

Who can apply?	University teachers and scientists who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or re- search institute in the US and Canada
What can be funded?	Research stays at universities or non-university research institutes in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 to 3 months
Value	<ul> <li>€2,000 monthly for assistant teachers, assistant professors and lecturers</li> <li>€2,150 monthly for professors</li> <li>Travel allowance</li> <li>Family allowances</li> </ul>

# Visiting Professorships

Who can apply?	Scholars in all disciplines who hold a doctorate or other terminal degree, and have an affiliation with a higher education institution	
What can be funded?	Guest lectureships in Germany	
Duration of the funding	3 months to 2 years	
Value	<ul> <li>Visiting Professors are paid by the host institution according to standard salary rates for civil servants and university faculty in Germany</li> </ul>	

# Learn German

Who can apply?	Faculty	
What can be fun- ded?	Online German language classes at Goethe Institut	
Duration of the funding	Varies based on course duration	
Value	• Approximately US\$ 700	

# **Germany Today**

Who can apply?	Representatives from universities, re- search institutions, and funding agen- cies, as well as colleagues from the fields of education policy and politics
What can be funded?	DAAD-organized tour of higher educa- tion institutions in Germany
Duration of the funding	1 week
Value	<ul> <li>Most program-related costs are covered by DAAD; international travel is at participants' own expense</li> </ul>

Group	Study	Visit

Who can apply?	Faculty
What can be funded?	Subject-related academic information visits to Germany organized by faculty members for groups of students
Duration of the funding	7 to 12 days
Value	<ul> <li>Up to €9,600 to subsidize room and board, depending on the size of the group and length of stay (€50 per participant per day)</li> </ul>
